Standard 3: Students will demonstrate the ability to access valid information, products and services to enhance health.

Accessing valid health information and health-enhancing products and services is critical in the prevention. early detection and treatment of health problems. This standard focuses on how to identify and access valid health resources and to reject unproven sources. Applying the skills of analysis, comparison, and evaluation of health resources empowers students to achieve health literacy. Students access valid health information, health-enhancing products, and services to prevent, detect, and treat health problems.

Standard 4: Students will demonstrate the ability to use interpersonal communication skills to enhance health and avoid or reduce health risks.

Effective communication enhances personal, family, and community health. This standard focuses on how healthy individuals use verbal and nonverbal skills to develop and maintain quality personal relationships. The ability to organize and to convey information and feelings is the basis for strengthening interpersonal interactions and reducing or avoiding conflict. Students demonstrate refusal, negotiation, and collaboration skills to enhance health and avoid or reduce health risks.

WHAT TO DO IN THE EXPO?


- **Career Exploration:** Explore healthcare careers through visiting exhibitors' booths. There are over twenty booths available at the expo that will share information about their field.

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PRIZES

The following lists the different ways that students will be awarded a prize:

- The first three students to visit each exhibitor table will receive a gift card. Students must get their activity sheet signed off by each exhibitor that is at the expo. Each exhibitor will have numbers on their station (tables). Once the student has communicated with the exhibitor they should request a signature from that exhibitor. The exhibitor should sign their name on the line where the table number is listed. (For example if the exhibitor's table number is 13. The student would have the exhibitor to sign their signature on line 13.
- Students that find the letters for HEALTHCARE will receive a prize. The letters for healthcare will be throughout the room. Students must have the exhibitor where each letter is located to sign their name. The first one that finds all of the letters for HEALTHCARE wins a gift certificate.
